Many dairy farmers rely on a team of bulls after AI mating and some farms only use bulls. Recent studies have found that an alarming number of the bulls used on dairy farms are not fit for the job. This situation can have a seriously reduce your herd's conception rate and calving pattern. To help you manage these risks, we have asked two experts on dairy reproduction and bull management to update you on the research findings and provide you with some simple tools to lower your risk of using poor performing bulls.

Dairy welfare we care: The Dairy Welfare Safety Net

Most Australian dairy farmers use sound husbandry practices that exceed minimum standards specified by government laws and regulations. The regulatory framework provides a safety net for animal welfare and ensures all farmers deliver a minimum standard of care. However, there is a risk that a small minority of less-responsible farmers could jeopardise the industry's solid track record for animal welfare if they do not adhere to the regulations and agreed codes of practice. This information sheet outlines animal welfare legislation and relevant codes of practice in Australia.
